Hello Zontians!

Zonta International recently did a virtual program for United States Zonta Club Presidents and Governors focuses on the stresses American clubs may be experiencing because of the political acrimony we experience so frequently.

I couldn't take part, but I recently received a copy of the PowerPoint from that program. One slide addressed the difference between Win-Lose and Win-Win approaches to decision-making.

Win-Lose (fixed position)

- > Me vs. You
- > Us vs. Them
- > Decision by Compromise
- > Pressure
- > Coercion
- > Manipulation

Win-Win (interest-based)

- > Us vs. the Problem
 - > Collaboration & Openness
- > Decision based upon Exploration
- > Fairness
- > Mutual Interests
- > Agreement

I thought another slide summed it up rather nicely:

Hard on Issues, Soft on People

- Focus on the issue not the person
- Focus on common interests
- Appeal to shared common interests when you have a conflict
- Use the shared common interests to find a solution
- Be solution-focused



I find it helpful to reflect on these suggestions as I deal with stressful interactions that are daily occurring within our state and national governments which can lop over into all parts of my life. I also remember that, ultimately, all parties need to buy into these approaches for them to be fully effective – which seems to be a challenge right now. That's another whole issue but perhaps these thoughts provide a roadmap that we as Zonta members can use as we strive to serve our community through service and advocacy.
